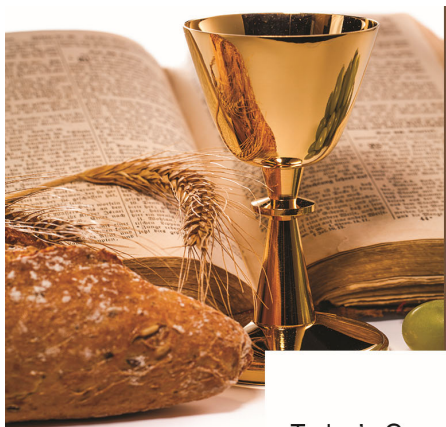

Gospel Reflection



August 1, 2021

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

GOD PROVIDES

Today's Gospel is a sequel to last week's account of Jesus feeding a large crowd with five barley loaves and a few fish. Here, Jesus is challenging the crowd to see in the bread they have eaten a sign of God's generosity in providing for all the blessings in their lives, as well as the blessing of life itself. The first reading, from Exodus, recounts how the escaped Hebrew slaves were fed in the wilderness, first with quail, then with manna. The psalm is a later reflection on the manna as the bread from heaven and a blessing from God. The selection from the letter to the Ephesians sketches the image of putting away the "old self" and putting on the new, emphasizing that a person's life in Christ needs to differ from their previous life, just as the life of a free person differs from that of a slave.

SIGNS AND WONDERS?

Today's Gospel continues into a second day the narrative that had begun the day before when, after crossing the lake to look for Jesus, a large crowd are fed with five barley loaves and two fish. The following day (today's reading), after more lake crossings, the people who had been miraculously fed are again searching for Jesus. However, they do so (as Jesus puts it) "not because you saw signs, but because you ate the loaves and were filled" (John 6:6).

In John's Gospel, the word "sign" has a distinct meaning. At the wedding at Cana, after telling how Jesus turned water into wine, the Evangelist notes "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs" that "revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him" (John 2:11). For John, signs are not just wonders to behold; they are about the revelation of God and a response of faith in Jesus.

OR MAYBE THE SIGN IS THE WONDER

When the crowd first arrives, Jesus notes that they had not appreciated the sign that he had already given; they are still focused on their physical hunger. When they ask for a sign, "that we may see and believe in you" (John 6:30), they refer to their ancestors who ate manna in the wilderness. Can Jesus top that? Can he give them more bread that will relieve them of their daily worries about going hungry?

Jesus reminds the crowd that it was not Moses who gave the "bread from heaven," but his Father. Further, the Father can give them the true bread from heaven that comes down and gives life to the world. There is a parallel in the Greek between working for food that perishes and doing the works of God, which is believing in Jesus as the one God has sent. This is the sign that the people missed the day before, the sign that Jesus is pointing out to them.

Like the Evangelist, the Church uses the word "sign" for its sacraments. Like the crowd, we are called to see similar "signs" of God's generosity in all the blessings of our lives.

PARISH/DIOCESAN NEWS

Mission Appeal for Warangal Diocese -India, weekend of August 7 & 8, 2021

Brief History: The Diocese of Warangal was erected on December 22, 1952 in the newly formed backward state of Telangana in India. It has an area of 1,14,840 sq.km with a population of 9 million people while Catholics are 68000(1% only). We have 65 parishes and 200 mission centers with 125 Priests, of whom 98 are Diocesan priests, with 650 Nuns and 18 religious Brothers working with their respective Charism in different fields of apostolate. This area is backward in development with repeated less rain-fall. About 80% of the people live in countryside depending on agriculture by rains only. About 45% of the people live under poverty line.

We run several mission stations aimed at catering to the needs of the poor and the underprivileged helping them with the basic necessities of life. We run orphanages for the poor boys and girls, run educational institutions, dispensaries, and other charitable works.

We undertake many social work programs directly aimed at helping the poor and needy and empowering women. In traditional Catholic areas we concentrate on re-evangelization and the training of the laity to become active apostles.

I am **Fr. Joji Reddy Thirumalareddy** bone fide priest of Warangal Diocese working in the Diocese of Madison, as Pastor at St. Faustina Parish, 318 S Main Street, Pardeeville, WI 53954. I was ordained a priest on April 18, 1996.

We are in the second week of the Summer Olympics in Tokyo and the phrase “sports is life” comes to mind. Sports can bring out the best in us, and unfortunately, at times, the worst in us. Below is a story I wanted to share from DePauw University’s Spring 2021 Magazine entitled “Good Sports”. Kathy

‘76 GRAD LIVES, PREACHES THE TRIATHLON GOSPEL BY MARY DIETER

Anybody can complete a triathlon, says the woman who ranked sixth in the world in the 2017 spring World Triathlon Championship.

The woman who is a six-time qualifier for the championship. The woman who in 2019 was second in a qualifying event for the Ironman 70.3 world championship. That’s 70.3 miles: 1.25 miles swimming, 56 miles biking and 13.1 miles running.

But before you dismiss Sue Engle Reynolds ‘76 as a patronizing elite athlete, know this: She was that anybody. She did it, and she has done it more than a dozen times, with more races on the horizon. And when she completed her first triathlon, she was half-way through a six-year journey during which she lost 200 pounds.

Reynolds was not overweight nor was she an athlete when she was studying zoology at DePauw in the 1970s. “When I left DePauw and started working, I became a teacher,” she said. “I loved my job, just loved it. And I often would stay up all night, writing lesson plans.” She would eat candy or cookies to stay awake and “the weight just started coming on” until she reached 335 pounds.

She was sensitive to societal standards, of course, and dieted, but the diets failed because “I was trying to please someone else’s expectations of me,” she said. In 2010, “nothing extraordinary happened. It was just one day I thought ‘this is ridiculous. I’ve had enough.’”

Reynolds started exercising, but “I think exercising is really boring,” she said. “So, in my mind, I started playing this little game. I would pretend that I’m training for a triathlon....It gave purpose to the exercise.” Later, when she realized she could accomplish the distances, “curiosity got ahold of me and I wondered if I could actually do all of that”. She was approaching her 60th birthday when she entered an indoor triathlon sponsored by the Indiana University Swim Club in 2013. “I actually dog-paddled part of the swim,” she said, and “in the transition between the swim and the bike, I sat down and ate a sandwich and I brushed my hair and I just took my time.” She came in last place, but she finished, and “I felt like I had won the Olympics...Everybody remembers their first finish, because it’s just an amazing feeling of accomplishment.”

She has written about her story in “The Athlete Inside: The Transforming Power of Hope, Tenacity, and Faith,” and donates 100% of her profits from it to the USA Triathlon Foundation to help those with physical disabilities and visual impairment participate in sports. In addition to conveying her messages that anyone can do a triathlon and that you can transform your life at any age, Reynolds tells about a spiritual awakening brought on by the rampant kindness and encouragement she has gotten from others. “I finally decided that God was showering me with all this kindness because he was trying to get my attention,” she said.”... It made me realize that I could be the face of God for others.”

Reynolds recently retired from her professional career, during which she worked as a high school counselor (she got a Master’s in counseling from IU in 1981) and a school counseling specialist for the Indiana Department of Education. She has handed over the reins of the nonprofit she founded 20 years ago, the American Student Achievement Institute, which helps community leadership teams transform their schools to enable all students, especially lower-income students, to achieve at a high level.

Reynolds did not compete in triathlons last year because of COVID-19. But she resumed racing in May, competing in the 65-69 age group. “I’d like to be doing this in my 90’s,” she said.
