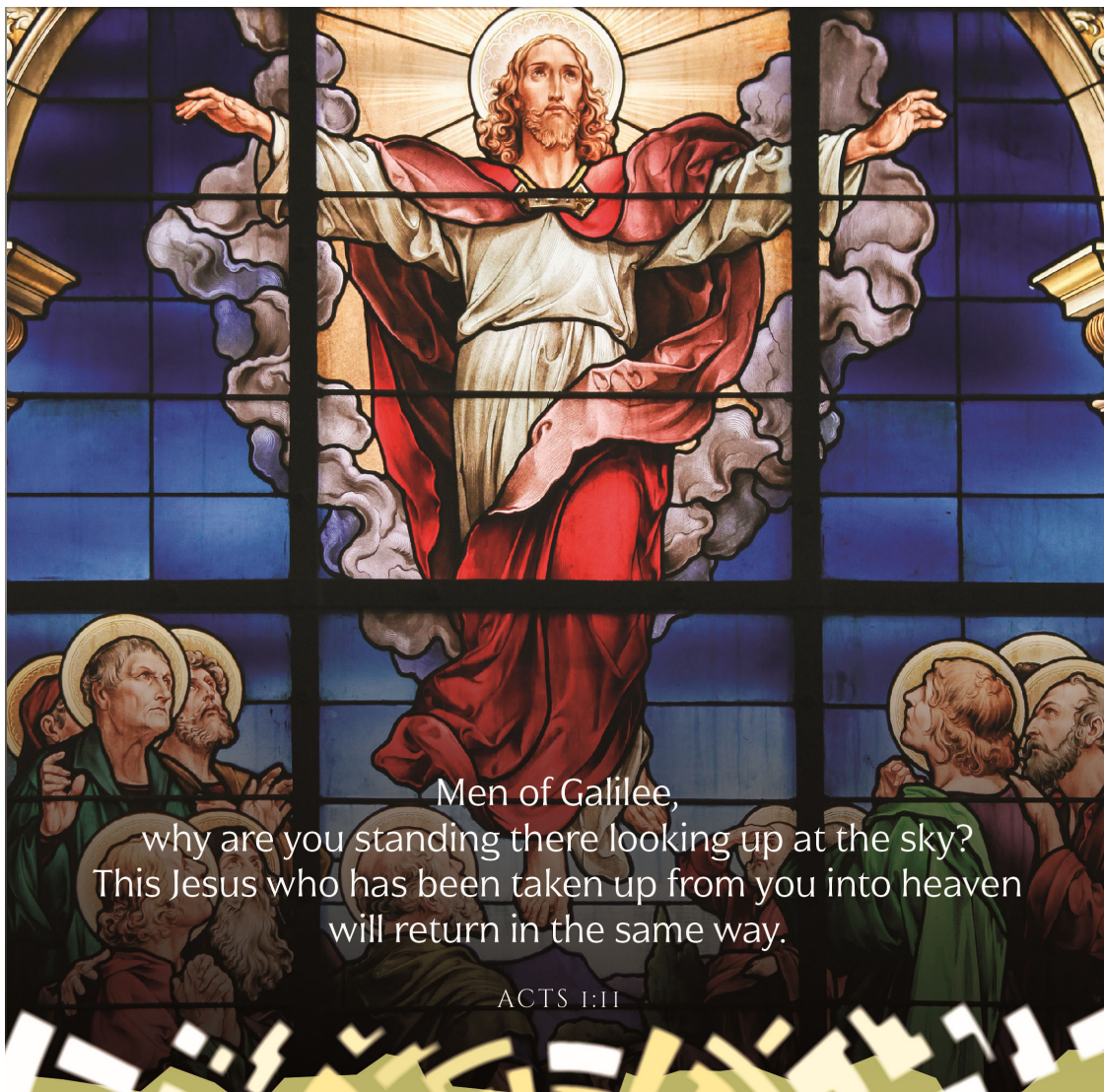

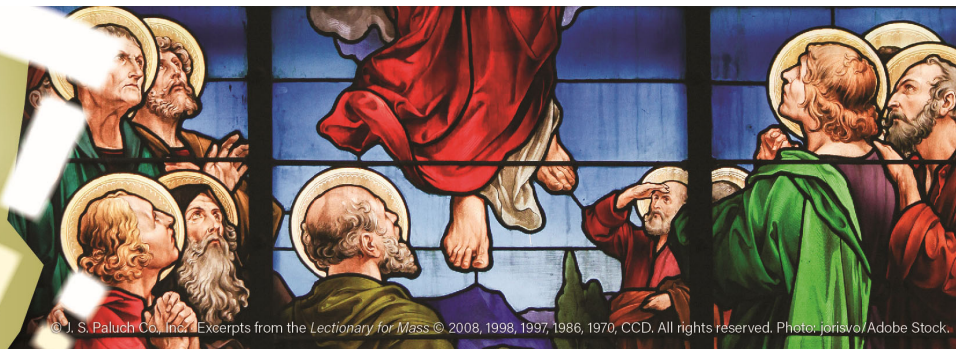

THE CENTRAL MYSTERIES

Throughout the season of Easter, we ponder the mysteries that are central to our faith in Jesus Christ. We reflect on Jesus' life, ministry, passion, death, and resurrection and consider the meaning of Christ's life and love. Today we celebrate Jesus' ascension and wonder with the apostles what we are to do and how we are to live as a result. As disciples, we are called to put our faith into action, grow to be more like the Lord, be united with other believers in community, and bring others to Christ through the way we live our lives. In so doing, we will live a life worthy of our call in Christ, a life of unity in the Spirit, of hope and peace.

WHY ARE YOU LOOKING AT THE SKY?

"Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" We can only imagine the apostles' astonishment, not only at Jesus' ascension, but at the message from the men in white garments who appeared at that very moment. Jesus had been crucified and died, rose from the dead and spent time with them, teaching them to understand how he had fulfilled all that had been written about the Messiah, and suddenly, he was taken up to heaven. Surely they would have wondered what was happening and what the meaning of Jesus' ascension was. We wonder with them. What does Jesus' ascension call us to be or do? We rely on the testimony of those who were with Jesus to grasp the mystery of his life, death, resurrection, and ascension. Their witness calls us to believe in Jesus, grow in relationship with him, and live as his disciples in the world.

YOU HAVE SEEN AND HEARD, NOW GO DO

It isn't enough to say we believe in Jesus. We are called to live as members of Christ's body and share the joy of faith with others. We do this by discerning and fulfilling our vocation, the ways in which God calls each of us to live. Often when we think of vocation, the first thing that comes to mind is the priesthood. But each of us experience vocational calls, to our state in life and to the ways in which we live, work, and serve. Each of us has been given different gifts and are called according to our gifts. We are equipped with talents and skills through which we may contribute to bringing the mercy, compassion, truth, goodness, and beauty of God's love to the world. What are your particular gifts and talents? How may you be called to use them to bring Christ's love to others, leading them to see and hear the Good News of Jesus Christ?

Feast of the Ascension

Christ's Ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Catechism of the Catholic Church 665-667).



Reflection: I don't know how all of this looked, but in my mind, I can imagine the disciples listening intently to Jesus as He told them that God was going to send the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit would strengthen them and give them the power to go forth and instruct all nations. Can you imagine standing and watching as Jesus ascended higher and higher until He disappears from view. With their minds open to all that Jesus had told them, I imagine they were filled with great amazement, wonder and joy.

Mary our Mother- Our Lady of Hope



In 1871, France was in the midst of the Franco-Prussian War. Nearly two-thirds of France was occupied by the German army. A young man named Auguste Barbedette had left his home in France to battle against the Prussians. Auguste's two younger brothers, Eugene, 12, and Joseph, 10, prayed the rosary daily in hope that their older brother would return home safely.


On the evening of Jan. 17, 1871, in the small French town of Pontmain, Our Lady of Hope appeared to Eugene and Joseph. In the night sky, the two boys saw Mary smiling at them, and they were filled with a sense of joy and peace. Mary was wearing a crown and a blue cloak that was covered with gold stars. Our Lady of Hope appeared for three hours before vanishing. A banner appeared beneath Our Lady, which read, "But pray, my children, God will hear you in a little while." The Franco-Prussian War ended 11 days later, and Auguste Barbedette would return home safely.

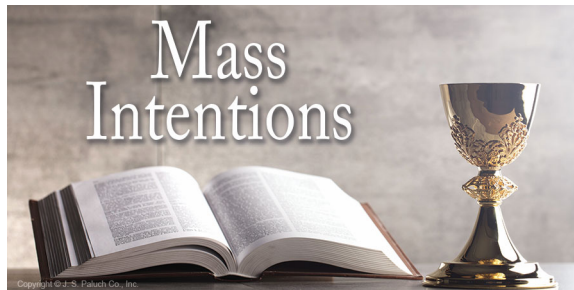

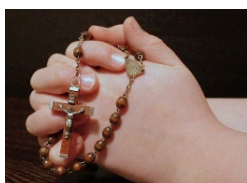


The 2022 Mass Intention Book is Now Open.

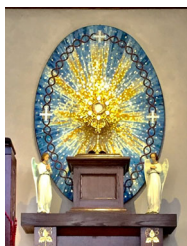

ADORATION CHAPEL REOPENING!!

The Adoration Chapel is targeted for opening **June 6th**; The Feast of Corpus Christi. There will be an Eucharistic procession from the Church to the Adoration Chapel following the 10:30am Mass.

The Adoration Chapel will be available for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 3:00pm – 8:00pm of each week. Sign up for permanent adoration hours will be via Sign Up Genius on our website. The Adoration Chapel is able to have a maximum of six people. However, Sign Up Genius will have a limit of four registered people for permanent adoration hours. This will allow two walk-in adorers per hour.

Please consider registering for a permanent hour. We require two permanent adorers per hour for the Adoration Chapel to be available for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

In addition, the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is available every Monday and Friday of each week from 7:30am to 8:15am followed by the praying of the Rosary at 8:20 in the Church. Daily Mass will commence at 8:45am.

St. Alexander Church opens at 7:30 Monday through Friday for personal pray time prior to daily mass.

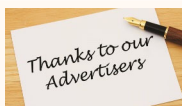
