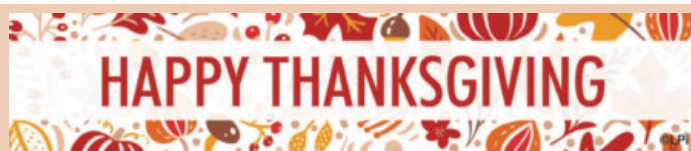
Two of our choirs, ***Joystir and Chancel***, are looking for an **accompanist**.

Faith Formation Service Project

Seventy-five brown bag lunches were made by the 3rd, 4th and 5th grade Faith Formation students on Sunday, 11/5. The students decorated the bags and packed the lunches for the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels, located in West Humboldt Park.

The mission is cared for by the Franciscans of the Eucharist, a group of young sisters, a brother and Bishop Bob Lombardi. Their goal is to help their neighbors who are materially poor and to share the treasure of the Catholic Faith. They are devoted to the Eucharist and believe that if a person doesn't see Jesus in the Eucharist, they won't be able to see Jesus in the materially poor.



Members of our faith community have been making lunches for the pantry for over 2 years, organized by Jan Turner and Elaine Jimenez. The food pantry at Our Lady of the Angels serves about 3,000 families per month. Brown bag lunches are collected most Sunday evenings from 7-8 pm and delivered to Our Lady of the Angels on Monday mornings. Each lunch should contain non-perishable items including a sandwich (like peanut butter and jelly), a juice pouch or box and several snacks. It's fine that these women are unassuming, but it's also time to recognize them for their hard work and love for our church community. On behalf of St. Alexander parish, I would like to thank these wonderful ladies for their time, love, energy, and commitment to our church family. Please, do the same. 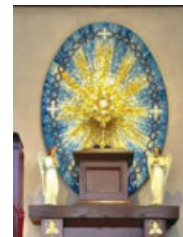

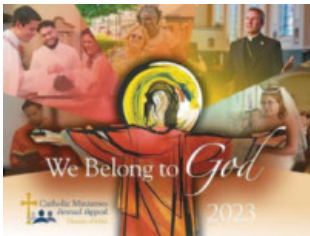
Parishioner Registration

2. Other parishes (*including St. Alexander*) often request verification of a person’s status as a practicing Catholic, attendance at Mass, sacraments, etc., when that person has been asked to be a **Godparent or Confirmation Sponsor**. Without registration, no such verification can be made.
3. Census numbers may determine how many priests are assigned to a parish and how many Masses and enrichment programs are planned and scheduled.


