

## THE ST. ALEXANDER GROTTO

In the spring, especially during May, our thoughts turn frequently to Our Lady, the crowning of Our Blessed Mother, etc. Perhaps some of you have wondered a little about the beautiful Mary statue, and the grotto which formerly enshrined

her. That grotto was in the southwest corner of the large Cornell Street parking lot. Why was it built and why was it placed there?

The grotto itself has a very interesting history. It was built in 1925 on the very spot where the Ku Klux Klan erected a burning cross when the news first spread about the plans to build the St. Alexander Church. Fr. Kennedy, founding pastor of the parish, when informed about the burning cross said, "we'll build a grotto on the very spot in honor of Our Blessed Mother."

The Morgenthaler Brothers, Carl and Andres, with the help of Chester Drake, Harry Waldon, Bill Blyth, Ralph Zinger and others, were able to borrow a horse and wagon from Mr. Casper, a local building contractor at that time. They hauled huge stones from the Lombard brick yard (the present Hammerschmidt School in Lombard stands on the site of this old brick yard.)

Father Kennedy and the 6th, 7th and 8th graders worked hard on Saturdays and after school hours hauling the smaller stones.

The original statue for the grotto was purchased by Father Kennedy and it was made of concrete (so it would not burn). Mr. Pelnar weather-proofed it and enameled it white. The story is told that eventually bees got into it and the statue deteriorated, so it was

replaced with the present statue.

On Memorial Day, 1926, the school children crowned the Blessed Virgin for the first time, and this custom has continued through the years

Perhaps the next time you gaze at the statue of Our Lady, your reverence will be rekindled and increased because of the unusual history attached to this lovely monument.

## Priests do not come from a big warehouse

When I was a little boy, I would often wonder where priests come from.

It's funny now, but I really thought there was a giant warehouse or training facility where they were waiting for a call from the coach to put them in the game. Almost like with baseball, when it was their time, they would get called up from the minor leagues and if they did well, they stayed and if they didn't, they'd be sent back.

Now I know that isn't the case, but to a second grader it made all the sense in the world. The truth is, priests come from families. They come from homes like yours and mine and they live ordinary lives like everyone around us. They go to school, play sports, have hobbies, some dated, some didn't, they participate in Church, and they have friends and siblings who help form their character and a real sense of who they are as a person and what they stand for. It is from within this community that they

begin to know and have a relationship with God.

One of the greatest obstacles to young men knowing that the priesthood is something they might be called to



So, what are three things a parent can do to create space for a priestly vocation in the family?

1. Make Sunday and any sacramen-

tal occasion (Confession) special.

- 2. Take time to talk about how God has impacted your own life and show your children how you pray.
- Live well the life of virtue and continue working on your own marriage.

Whether it is simply the prayers before meals, Weekly Sunday Mass, or an occasionally rosary or sacrament of confession, these men encountered God and began to walk with Him. They may not have always prayed or been the best people, but God is faithful and walked with them through their ups and downs just like our families do with us.

From within the family, a vocation is cultivated, and it is only with the support of parents, grandparents, siblings and friends that a young man can be open to a priestly vocation.

At some point, these men began to recognize within themselves that they were made for more — for a deeper relationship that called them to make a gift of themselves, to pour themselves out for the sake of others.
