



A FINAL RESTING PLACE FOR 51 PEOPLE FROM YEARS GONE BY.

Sts. Peter & Paul Cemetery in Naperville was the destination of final disposition for 51 person's cremated remains. Deacon Chris Cochran of St Alexander Church in Villa Park presided over the service to inter the remains of 51 loved ones, who passed away between the mid 1970s and 2011. The remains were carefully maintained in the care and custody of Steuerle Chapel and Knollcrest Funeral Home for decades. Assisting Deacon Cochran at the cemetery was our Funeral Director Ema Troxtell who has had strong experience with ensuring cremated remains receive a dignified service and a final disposition. Whether at Abraham Lincoln

National Cemetery or the consecrated ground of the Diocese of Joliet, Ema has been a key part of making sure all remains are handled professionally and appropriately. The Diocese of Joliet kindly donated the crypt space for the interment of the remains of all 51 people. As Ema states, "Some of these loved ones have no family. Some are far away. Some may have simply forgotten. Some find it difficult to accept them; there are plenty of reasons why they haven't been picked up over these decades of time. That said, every one of these lives meant something and deserves to rest in peace in an appropriate place of final disposition. I'm honored to do my part to see that this happens".



The impact of formation into priesthood

When someone asks me what the seminary is, I liken it to a garden bed which takes the seeds of a vocation to the priesthood, plants them in rich and nutritious soil, provides them with the necessary sun, moisture, and darkness so that the seed can grow and bear much fruit. It provides a space to remove the weeds of human weakness and protect the vocation from the buffets of the storms and winds that come with life.

I see this in my own experience of formation. When I began seminary after my four years at the University of Illinois, where I studied chemical engineering, I thought I had my life together and knew a thing or two. What I discovered living with 150 other men was that I was embarking upon a journey to grow in honesty with myself, my heart, and God. One day on retreat, I was telling God I wanted to be a great priest, and He responded, 'then you must know what people are feeling and experiencing.' I told him I did, and He gently corrected me and said, 'to do that, you must know what you are feeling and

experiencing:

I didn't know that I had closed off my heart to love of my neighbor due to all the bullying I encountered in grade school. I was usually angry, but wouldn't let anyone

see it, except when I exploded. I didn't trust people.

In seminary, a space was created to assist me in being honest with myself, my heart and God about the pain and betrayals of life. It gave me a space to avail myself to counseling, spiritual direction and good friendships which helped me grow, heal, and forgive. The beautiful fruit of this time was that I grew in a genuine love for my brother and all who I would be called to serve in the Church as a priest.

It was through the generosity of the Diocese of Joliet faithful that I was able to attend seminary. I invite you to prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit, how he might be inviting you to support our current seminarians in their formation to the priesthood.

God Bless you and be assured of my prayers for you.

ABOUT FR. BORELLO

Fr. Steven Borello is a priest of the Diocese of Joliet currently serving as the Director of Vocations.

Fr. Steven grew up in Glen Ellyn, Illinois, and is the oldest of 4 children.

He attended the University of Illinois in Champaign-Urbana where he studied chemistry and chemical engineering.

While there, he received a call to the seminary to discern the priesthood.

He received his Bachelors in Theology and Masters of Divinity from Mundelein Seminary and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Joliet in 2011.

He first served as an associate pastor at Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills and was then transferred to Saints Peter and Paul Parish in Naperville in June of 2014.

In August of 2015, he began serving at St. John Vianney College Seminary as a spiritual director, director of human formation, and instructor to over 120 men discerning a priestly vocation.


He returned to the Diocese of Joliet in August 2018 to begin as the Director of Vocations.
